Passage I

At present, many people are likely to stay healthy by focusing more on their diet. Some turn themselves into vegetarians and vegans who do not consume meat. Nonetheless, there are some differences between them.

Vegetarians tend to consume dairy products and eggs. However, vegetarians are categorized into 4 groups: 1. Vegetarians - do not eat meat, fish and poultry 2. Semi - Vegetarians - occasionally have meat diet or eat only fish and poultry 3. Lacto - Vegetarians - do not eat meat, fish, and poultry, but consume dairy products except cheese 4. Ovo - Lacto Vegetarians - do not eat any kind of meat but milk and eggs. On the contrary, vegans do not eat meat, eggs, milk, honey, or any food derived from animals as well as do not use any **inedible** animal-based products.

Vegetarians select their diet for their health, their religious beliefs, or political reasons, but vegans **incline** to avoid food and products derived from animals as a result of their strong political beliefs to protect animals.

What are benefits from being vegetarians and vegans? Most studies show that vegetarians and vegans have good health. Particularly, vegans are good at avoiding food may cause allergy such as shrimp, prawn and dairy products. They generally eat a great amount of plant - based food such as whole grains, root vegetables and leafy vegetables. Many studies found that both vegetarians and vegans have lower risk of cancer than those who are meat-eaters. Vegetarians and vegans have good cardiovascular systems. In addition, there were fewer deaths from diabetes and kidney failure among those who are vegetarians and vegans.

Nonetheless, some studies suggested that vegans may need to take B12 supplements and other dietary supplements such as iron, vitamin D or amino acids since their diet may lack these essential nutrients which are normally contained in meat, fish, and poultry.

Passage II

European Debt Crisis was a failure of Europe. The currency which 17 European countries used and their financial institutions collapsed. This involved the corruption and the failure of 5 countries in Europe, which are Greece, Portugal, Ireland, Italy, and Spain, in generating sufficient economic growth to have the ability to pay back their debts.

How did this crisis happen? Most of the European history involved wars, and the countries that were in the same wars were unlikely to do business together. The countries in Europe had trade barriers - **tariff fees** and exchange fees due to different currencies. As a result, doing business across territories was quite different. Back to after World War II, European countries started to **incorporate**; the land **invasion** was declined. The countries with shared borders could mutually trade. The gathering of European countries diminished wars in Europe, and then the Fall of the Berlin Wall in 1989 caused the uniting of East Berlin and West Berlin. After the Fall,

27 states from 17 countries in Europe signed the Maastricht Treaty and created the European Union (EU). This made doing business across borders easier; however, there was still one barrier, which was the different currency.

10 years later, the Euro, the single European currency was introduced in 1999. The Euro banknotes and coins were officially presented as legal tender in 2002. The countries in Eurozone adopted the Euro as their common currency, used one unified Monetary Policy and gave the control to European Central Bank: ECB.

Before Eurozone was created, many countries in Europe agreed to pay high interest if they borrow the money as well as to be able to borrow only a small amount of it. On the contrary, when the Eurozone was created and they used Monetary Policy, the Eurozone members could borrow a great amount of money with a low - interest rate. Smaller countries could borrow with only 3% interest as much as Germany could since the Eurozone members could use Germany's credit cards. Greece, Italy, Portugal, Ireland, and Spain borrowed the amount of money they couldn't payback. This resulted in the other countries in Eurozone in suffering from debts, and in putting their efforts to support Greece, Italy, Portugal, Ireland, and Spain to pay back the borrowed money.

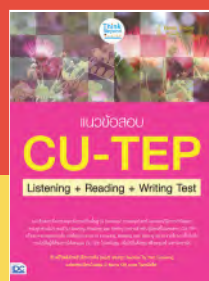
